A few months ago two young people driving along the road saw a small cat lying in the shoulder of the road. They pulled over to see if anything could be done and discovered that the little orange and white kitten was still alive! A call to New Hope Animal Rescue was made to see if we could examine the little thing and possibly rehab him from any injuries that resulted from the accident. He proved to be hypothermic and hypo-glycemic but not badly injured.

After a few weeks under our care he was doing well with some locomotor issues but on the whole he was lucky to be alive—we named him "LUCKY". Lucky has just been adopted to his forever home and is thriving after a tough period in his young life. Many thanks to the two young people who cared enough to stop and check out a small body in the snow at the side of the road.

Our mission continues to thrive in dedicating the enhancement of the welfare of all animals that come into our care. We will provide these animals with every opportunity to live long and healthy lives by fostering and finding forever homes. An Update of Our Shelter

The past two years have been eventful with Covid dominating our thoughts and actions these days. We have had to navigate the protocols on how to care for our volunteers as they do the work of caring for our animals & finding them forever homes as well as potential adopters visiting our shelter. We can't thank our volunteers enough for their ongoing support during this time. In the meantime, we press on and do the work we have always done; our rescue doesn't stop it just changes faces.

Overall, we are doing well considering the climate of our economy in this time of the pandemic and uncertainty. As most of you know the property that our shelter is located has been sold and we are currently looking for a new location. When this will happen is not known but we are continuing to be proactive in looking for that space when needed. We hope that things will start to turn around and we will be on track for 2022 – we are already seeing some changes for the better.

New Hope Animal Rescue continues to find forever homes for all animals that come into our care. Over the past two years we have found forever homes for 357 critters that have come into our care!

Pets for Alice Update

The Pets For Alice program has been a wonderful way to give senior cats and dogs a second chance to find a home of their own and providing love and company to seniors in our community. The program began in 2014 and since then, there have been 36 animals (including the 18 we have now) that have been apart of the program.

There are currently 17 foster parents in the program as well as 6 home visitors, including our veterinarian Dr Kate Flanigan. The home visits are generally monthly or bi monthly and include nail trims and helping with delivering food and litter if needed. All the animals in the program have yearly vet check ups which include being vaccinated. This program has been especially important during the last two years of Covid when its been hard for some seniors to have visits with their families and friends and often feel isolated. Many have said how having an animal has given them a reason to get up in the morning and something to take care of as well as all the unconditional love.
